May 15 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

The Experience of Place: Visual Awareness – Buildings and Streetscapes  
Participants explore the LeDroit Park community and record their observations through sketching, photography, model building, and writing.

May 16 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

Change Over Time: Observation and Analysis - Past and Present  
Participants survey the history of the neighborhood, from its original geography to the present using primary resources such as maps, photographs, and architectural drawings. Participants will learn about how and why the community has changed, and will begin to articulate community issues.

May 17 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

Designing for Change: Advocacy for Positive Community Change  
Participants work in teams to develop curriculum projects that address educational standards, with clear learning objectives, defined resources, and age-appropriate activities.
